Developed in partnership with John Jay faculty, employers in the field of criminal justice and reentry, and people with past criminal legal system involvement, the curriculum focuses on the skills entry-level and prospective employees need to apply their lived experience toward a career of serving others. 	The Young Adult Success Corps (YASC) A great opportunity for young adults to serve their city and gain important life skills. As YASC members, young adults ages 18 to 24 who are on probation spend six to ten months working for local community organizations and city agencies.	Opportunity for young adults
	NYC Justice Corps A supportive, transitional environment focused on building skills and promoting the behavioral changes that will keep Corps members out of the justice system. The program prepares Corps members for placement in education, training, and work opportunities.
