

New York School Promotion and Graduation Requirements

Parents and students should begin thinking about high school graduation requirements well before a student's fourth year of high school. If you have any questions about whether a student will be ready for graduation, ask to meet with the student's guidance counselor.

PROMOTION CRITERIA FOR EACH GRADE

- Grade 9: Earn a minimum of 5 1/2 credits
- Grade 10: Have a minimum of 11 credits
- Grade II: Have a minimum of 16 1/2 credits

CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION: 22 credits required

- 4 in English
- 3 in Math
- 4 in Social Studies
 - 2 in Global History, 1 in U.S. History, 1 1/2 in Economics.
 - $\frac{1}{2}$ in Economics, $\frac{1}{2}$ in Government

- 3 in Science
 - I in Life ScienceI in Physical Sciences,I additional in Life Science orPhysical Science
- 3 in Math
- I in Second Language

- I in Visual Art, Music, Dance, and/or Theater
- 2 in Physical Education (1/2 each semester)
- ½ in Health
- 3¹/₂ in Elective Areas

EXAM REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION: 5 exams required

Four required Regents exams:

English Language Arts, one Math, one History (U.S. History OR Global History), and one Science

- Passing score of 65 required.
- However, if a student scores a 60, 61, 62, 63, or 64 on one or two exams, they may be able to appeal the exam(s) and still graduate. Please see AFC's fact sheet <u>Appeal Options for Regents Exams</u>
- Regents exams are offered in January, June, and August.

AND one more State-approved exam

chosen by the student, including:

- Additional Regents exams
- SAT II exams
- Advanced Placement (AP) exams
- International Baccalaureate (IB) exams
- Language Other Than English (LOTE) exam
- State-approved CTE exams
- Career Development and Occupational Studies (CDOS) Credential

NOTE:

If you a planned to take or re-take a Regents exam, work toward CDOS hours, or take a Language Other Than English (LOTE) exam in **June and/or August 2020**, you may be eligible to graduate without taking the exam. To learn more about this COVID-19 exemption click <u>here</u>.
