## Graduation Requirements Worksheet

Step 1: Does the student meet the credit requirements?

*Students with disabilities may be exempt from this requirement if noted in their Individualized Education Program (IEP).
Step 2: Did the student receive a 65 or above on 4 Regents +1 additional state test or CDOS Credit?**

Ifyou planned to take or re-take a Regents exam, work toward a CDOS, or take a Language Other Than English (LOTE) exam during COVID-19, you may be eligible to graduate without taking the exam. ## If the student completed requirements in Steps 1 \& $2 \longrightarrow \underline{\text { Regents Diploma }}$

What if...
(I) The student did not earn 22 credits? Students must complete credit requirements to get a diploma.
(2) The student did not receive $65+$ on all required exams? There are additional pathways for the student to graduate with a diploma.

Check the boxes to determine if the student gets a diploma. Make sure you review each option!

Option I: Did the student receive a 60-64 on I or 2 exams

If yes, student can appeal score(s). If student's appeal is successful AND:
$\square$ 65+ on all other exams (or exams + CDOS)
$\square$ passed the class(es) corresponding to failing exam(s)
If checked all of the above and successfully appealed one exam $\boldsymbol{7}$ Regents Diploma
If checked all of the above and successfully appealed two exams $\boldsymbol{\boldsymbol { \gamma }}$ Local Diploma

Option 2: Is the student an English Language Learner (ELL) who arrived in the United States between 9th and I 2th grade and received a 55-59 on ELA exam?

If yes, student can appeal their ELA score. If student's appeal is successful AND:65+ on all other exams (or exams + CDOS; may appeal I other exam with score of 60-64)
took the ELA exam at least twicepassed the class(es) corresponding to failing exam(s)

If checked all of the above $\rightarrow$ Local Diploma

Option 3: Is the student a student with a disability (SWD) who received $55+$ on all exams?

If yes, student is eligible for a Local Diploma

Option 4: Is the student a SWD who received 52-54 on I or 2 exams? If yes, student can appeal score(s). If student's appeal is successful AND:


55+ on all other exams (or exams + CDOS)
took failing exam(s) at least twice
passed class(es) corresponding to failing score(s)

If checked all of the above $\rightarrow$ Local Diploma

## Option 5: Is the student a SWD who received a 45-54 on science or history exams?

If yes, did the student receive:
65+ on any other Regents exam
$\checkmark$ High score can be an ELA or math exam
55+ on all other exams (exams + CDOS)
If checked all of the above $\boldsymbol{\boldsymbol { \theta }}$ Local Diploma
**Student cannot use this option for 45-54 on ELA or math exams**

Option 6: Is the student a SWD who received 55+ on ELA and math exams?

If yes, did the student receive:Below 55 on 3 exams
OR
Below 55 on 2 exams and no CDOS credit
If checked one of the above $\boldsymbol{7}$ Eligible to request a Superintendent's Determination for a Local Diploma
**Can use this option if successfully appeal ELA/math exams from Option $4^{* *}$

## Option 7: The student is a SWD who received CDOS credit but did not receive 55+ on

 ELA and math exams $\boldsymbol{7}$ Eligible to request a Superintendent's Determination for a Local Diploma.The student's parent, not the school, requests a Superintendent's Determination.
